FILLIES ARE FEARLESS, JUST LIKE YOU!


A young female horse is called a filly.

Did you know that horses are as powerful and unique as you are? There are more than 350 breeds around the world!




MALANI

These horses are rare. Malani horses are found in India and are famous for their perky, inward turned ears!




ZEBRA

Did you know that the African Zebra is a type of horse? It's considered a wild horse. Each zebra's stripes are one-of-a-kind, like snowflakes!




BASHKIR CURLIES


APPALOOSA

Appaloosa horses are best known for their spotted coats, and they are found mostly in North America. Each horse has its own unique spot pattern.



MINIATURE HORSE

A miniature horse is defined by its small height—usually less than 34 to 38 inches. They are small due to selective breeding. Mini horses are so smart, that they can be house trained like dogs!



AKHAL TEKE

Pronounced AH-CALL TEK-KEE. This breed has a dazzling coat that earned it the nickname "Golden Horse." The Akhal Teke come from Turkmenistan, which is a country in central Asia.
