Girl Scouts love the outdoors!

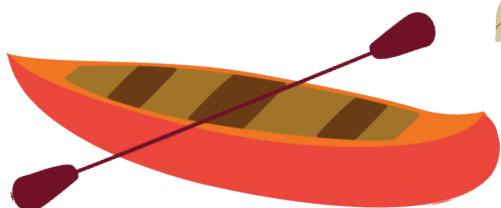
Whether it's cold and snowy or hot and sunny, Girl Scouts love the outdoors! Many Girl Scouts are making the most of winter outside - learning to snowshoe, making hot chocolate over an open campfire, even camping at council properties. It won't be long, however, before the weather changes and we welcome Girl Scouts to summer camp. Registration is open now!

Campers as young as kindergartners will enjoy our day camp programs at Camp Kettleford in Bedford, NH, at Camp Seawood in Portsmouth, NH, or Camp Twin Hills in Richmond, VT. Day camp welcomes those who have completed pre-K through eighth grade. Younger campers may participate in one-week programs, while those who have finished grades 4-8 may choose one- or two-week day camp programs that include an overnight experience. Day camp provides an environment for Girl Scouts to learn new skills and make new friends through campfire cooking, climbing the bouldering wall, enjoying sing-alongs, tie-dying a T-shirt, and more!

Those who have completed grades 1-11 and are ready for some time away from home will love the resident camp programs at Camp Farnsworth in Thetford, VT. Choose from one- or two-week programs where you can sing around the campfire, swim, canoe, ride horseback, make something in our wood shop, climb the tall tower, shoot an arrow, and just hang out with friends. Girls in grades 9 and up can also take on leadership roles like camp aide or counselor in training.

As a Girl Scout family, you are invited to have a camping experience together on our properties! Live together in a tent, cabin, or Adirondack, cook your own meals over a campfire, and enjoy camp staff-led activities. We're even celebrating Halloween early with Fam-O-Ween family camping where you can dress up for an evening trick-or-treat, go on a glow-stick night hike, and enjoy all the regular camp activities.

Wonders of Nature

For over 100 years, girls have discovered, explored, and strengthened their outdoor skills and commitment to environmental stewardship through Girl Scouting. Guided by supportive adults and peers, Girl Scouts discover the wonders of nature, experience the thrill of adventure, and challenge themselves and one another to reach new heights!

Girl Scouts' national outdoor programming features a variety of fun, challenging, and experiential activities that empower girls as they develop attitudes, skills, and behaviors essential to effective leadership in the outdoors:

Outdoor Competence:

Girls engage safely and responsibly in a range of outdoor activities (e.g., practicing Leave No Trace and knowing what to bring to be prepared in the outdoors).

Outdoor Confidence:


Girls have confidence in their outdoor abilities and are willing to try new and challenging outdoor activities.

Environmental Stewardship:

Girls understand how their behaviors impact the environment and what they can do to protect the natural world.

Outdoor Interest:

Girls have a love of nature and an interest in the natural world.



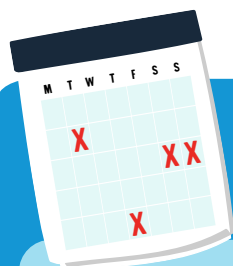
Girls whose troops do three or more outdoor activities a year get more enjoyment out of the outdoor activities they do and are more excited about being a Girl Scout than girls whose troops do only one or two outdoor activities a year.

Girl Scout national outdoor badges are an especially important way for girls to explore the outdoors and nature, try new things, and improve their skills. For each additional badge earned, girls became more competent in their outdoor skills. When badges are coupled with other outdoor activities, like hiking, camping, and adventure activities, girls are more satisfied with their Girl Scout experience and more likely to want to return. Finally, the findings show that Girl Scouts provides girls access to new and challenging outdoor experiences, helping them to move outside of their comfort zones and preparing them to be outdoor and nature enthusiasts who take the lead in caring for the environment.



Even one badge is enough to make a difference, increasing a girl's outdoor competence.

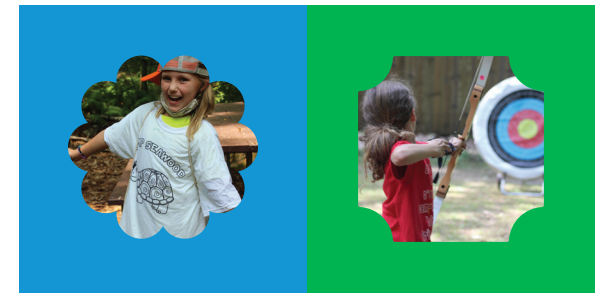
